Born after April 1, 1976 (age under 45)

If you are out of Japan having trouble coming back, please indicate your curr situation. Applications will be declined if not correctly completed and submitted. If there any problem or missing documents in your application, notice mail will be sent the application will be considered as incomplete. All missing documents and / revised documents must be resubmitted by the application deadline.
